"Adirondack Paddle Pursuit" was created to stimulate and challenge visitors and residents of the Adirondack State Park to explore a sampling of the scenic waterways coursing through our magnificent park, using one's favorite non-motorized vessel. We believe paddling these waters offers an exceptional opportunity for an intimate viewing of the park's aquatic ecosystems with their characteristic flora and fauna.

Adirondack Paddle Pursuit is sponsored by the Cold River Chapter of the Adirondack Mountain Club (ADK). Recognition of completion of this extensive paddling experience is provided in the form of a colorful patch. We ask those wishing to earn this patch to be members of the ADK and to have paddled, since January 1, 2001, on each of at least forty-eight (48) different waterways: ten (10) large lakes, twenty (20) small lakes & ponds, and eighteen (18) rivers & streams. The waterways to choose from (none of which require paddling skills beyond Class I water) are listed inside this brochure along with a log to record your outings.
