The Sherpas of Nepal Over 60 Years: A Talk and Slide Show



Held at old Clinton County Courthouse (2nd floor auditorium).

Bruce Kokernot and his wife Wendy Gilchrist, both physicians, have seen many

changes in Nepal and it's people ever since Sir Edmund Hillary, who together with Tenzing Norgay completed a climb to the summit of Mount Everest in 1953.

Sir Edmund, a philanthropist, built schools and hospitals for the Sherpas beginning in 1963.

It was those hospitals which brought Bruce and Wendy to Nepal to volunteer in local Nepalese and Indian hospitals for extended periods of time from 1985 to 1997. They have returned to Nepal and northern India 5 times to hike and visit friends and family. Because of their work and travel, they have what Bruce calls "a long perspective of the changes that have been happening to the Himalayan people"

Mr. Kokernot's program begins at 7 p.m. followed by a Chapter business meeting at 8 p.m. Both are free and open to the public.

OLEAVE NO TRACE THE 7 PRINCIPLES

1. PLAN AHEAD AND PREPARE

- Know the regulations and special considerations for the area you'll be visiting.
- Prepare for extreme weather, hazards, and emergencies.
- Always leave your itinerary with someone at home.
- Travel in small groups to minimize impacts.

2. TRAVEL AND CAMP ON DURABLE SURFACES

- Hike in the middle of the trail; walk through (not around) puddles/mud.
- Stay off of vegetation; walk on rocks where possible.
- Camp in designated sites where possible.
- In other areas, don't camp within 150 feet of water, trail, or a road.

3. DISPOSE OF WASTE PROPERLY

- Pack out all trash (including toilet paper), leftover food, and litter.
- Use existing privies or dig a 6-8 inch deep cathole at least 150 feet from water.
- Wash yourself and dishes at least 150 feet from water. If needed, use only small amounts of biodegradable soap.

4. LEAVE WHAT YOU FIND

- Leave rocks, plants, and other natural objects as you find them.
- Let photos, drawings, or journals help capture your memories.
- Do not build structures or furniture or dig trenches.

5. MINIMIZE CAMPFIRE IMPACTS

- Use a portable stove to avoid the lasting impact of a fire.
- Where fires are permitted, use existing fire rings and collect only downed wood.
- Burn all fires to ash, put out campfires completely, and hide traces of fire

6. RESPECT WILDLIFE

- Observe wildlife from a distance.
- Avoid wildlife during mating, nesting, and other sensitive times.
- Control pets at all times, and clean up after them.

7. BE CONSIDERATE **OF OTHERS**

- Respect others and protect the quality of their experience.
- Let natural sounds prevail; avoid loud sounds and voices.
- Be courteous and yield to other users; take breaks to one side of the trail.



Wildlife Spotlight

The Wood Duck (Aix sponsa) is one of the most stunningly pretty of all waterfowl. Males are iridescent chestnut and green, with ornate patterns on nearly every feather; the elegant females have a distinctive profile and delicate white pattern around the eye. These birds live in wooded swamps, where they nest in holes in trees or in nest boxes put up around lake margins. They are one of the few duck species equipped with strong claws that can grip bark and perch on branches. The Wood Duck is the only North American duck that regularly produces two broods in one year.
